



The Elements in Witchcraft

Found in the *East*, this element governs over *Libra*, *Gemini*, and *Aquarius*. It represents *Communication and Intellect*. Often it is represented by the color *Yellow*. The *Swords* tarot suite is ruled by this element.

This is the  **AIR**

Element for building momentum and reflecting or puzzling through something.

Other manifestations: Dandelion Quartz, Citrine, Bells, Mint, Ginger and Spring.

FIRE

Found in the *South*, this element governs over *Aries*, *Leo* and *Sagittarius*. It represents *Passion*, *Willpower* and *Transformation*, Often it is represented by the color *Red*. The *Wands* tarot suite is ruled by this element.

This is the Element for Active change, Building up Energy.

Other manifestations include *Cinnamon*, *Snakes*, *Foxes*, *Chili Powder*, *Pepper*, *Carnelian*, and *Summer*.

Found in the *West*, this element governs over *Pisces*, *Cancer* and *Scorpio*. It represents *Emotions*, *Intuition*, and the *Subconscious*. Often it is represented by the color *Blue*. The Water triangle tarot suite is ruled by this element.

Earth  Found in the *North*, this element governs over *Virgo*, *Capricorn*, and *Taurus*. It represents *Stability and the Material World*. Often it is represented by the color *Green*. The *Pentacles* tarot suite is ruled by this element. This is the Element of Grounding, Fertility, and Luck.

Other manifestations include Basil, Bears, Wolves, Money, Protection, Obsidian, Malachite, Winter.

This is the original Element, from which all others came. It is not represented by a direction, season, or suite, and it does not need to be called into a circle since it is always around and within us. Sometimes it is represented by the color White or a Rainbow, since they are made up of all colors. Meditation can help to be more aware of the element around us.

Why call the quarters?

Aside from providing a way to “set the scene”, get yourself mentally grounded and ready to work magic, pray, or perform a ritual. Calling the Quarters when opening a circle is an important way to protect yourself by creating a Boundary. Inside the circle is sacred, where magic is performed and contained, and outside the circle is the mundane. The four elements act as Bouncers, or Bounding boxes, keeping the circle held together. They are also called Watchtowers since we call them into the circle literally to watch over us and our energy. The idea of Calling in the four elements— Air, Fire, Water, and Earth— comes in part from the Lesser Key of Solomon. A demonology book from the 1800’s that described it as needed to keep out unwanted demons when casting Magick. That is not necessarily the only source, for example Gerald Gardner claimed the Witches he learned from did this on their own as well.
